'Keep Your Distance' warrants a close examination

(R for sex, language, 1h36m). Indie filmmaker Stu Pollard's "Keep Your Distance," a dark drama about a local celebrity about to fall from grace, is a solid follow-up for the Louisville director. Pollard has assembled a nice cast for his story about a local radio personality, David Dailey (Gil Bellows of "Ally McBeal"), his adventurous wife (Kim Raver of "24") and a traveling saleswoman (Jennifer Westfeldt of "Kissing Jessica Stein"). An anonymous admirer triggers a series of events that leads up to a fairly convenient, but ably executed ending. The film never quite lives up to its billing as a thriller but it has excellent production values and accomplishes quite a bit with a small budget. (Jeffrey Bruner) *Fleur*
